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



## **Cody Meints**

An interview with an HCS Alumnus

## Talk about your life journey after graduating from HCS.



Cody is married to HCS's middle school teacher Megan!

I'm going to start back just a little before graduating from HCS. During my grade 12 year I completed three days of volunteer work experience at the Equity Mine. At the end of this short period, I asked Mike Aziz if they were looking for any summer students and he let me know they had an Environmental Technician and did not need to hire summer students at that time. Then, after graduating from HCS, I attended UNBC where I started to work on my chemistry degree. After my first year, I started to look for a summer job and my mom suggested I phone Mike to see if he had anything available. I told her what Mike had told me the summer prior and she said: "What's the worst that will happen? He might say 'no.'" Well, God's providence showed through. There happened to be an opening at the mine that summer and I was able to fill in temporarily. I then went back to school for my second year and during the semester I was offered a "full time" job -"full time" being eight months of the year until I was able to finish my degree. I eventually finished my Bachelor of Science degree majoring in Chemistry in 2015, six years after graduating from high school. A few short years later, in 2018, I was promoted to the Site Supervisor role with a host of new responsibilities.

# How did the education you received from HCS impact this journey?

My education from HCS is what pushed me into my choice of degree and is ultimately where my career path has led. I always enjoyed math and science through all the years of elementary and high school. Chemistry 11 and 12 sparked a bit more of a special interest as they were an amazing combination of the two. Adding to this was that in Chemistry 12, Mr. Ewald would take the class for tours to the mine every year. This tour showed a good

overview of the site and the fact that a chemistry degree could land you a job in that field. And last but not least was the volunteer work experience we were required to complete that I chose to do at the mine; this sold me on that type of work even more.




## How does your faith impact how you see your role within your profession?

Through the years, the methods and recipes may have been tweaked to perfection, but one thing remains the same – the success of Apple Pie Day is not just measured in pies made or funds raised, but in the joy and togetherness it creates in our school community.




