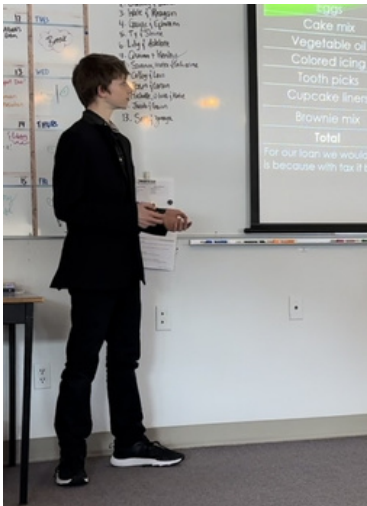
DRAGONS' DEN

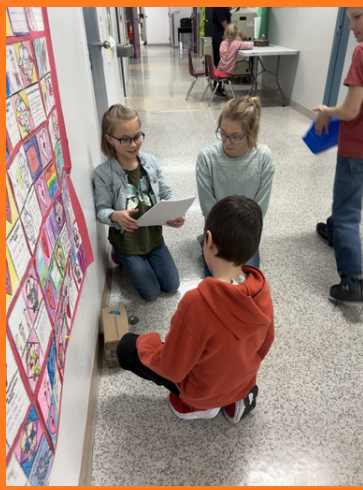
Our 7/8 students boldly faced the Dragons in their own version of the Dragons' Den, showcasing their emerging entrepreneurial talents.
