Simple, wholesome options like apples, whole grain crackers, or carrot sticks can make great snacks—especially with a tasty dip like hummus to add flavor. "Sushi" Sandwich



With the exact same ingredients you normally use to make a sandwich and the aid of a simple rolling pin, you can turn a sandwich your kids already love into visually enticing "sushi".

Step 1: Cut the crusts off the slice of bread and roll out as thin as possible with a rolling pin.

Step 2: Spread the piece of bread with your chosen spread and fillings. Don't overfill!

Step 3: Starting at the side closest to you (the filled end) tightly roll the mixture and press to seal into a roll. I dab a bit of spread across the end of the roll to act as a glue sealing the roll.

Step 4: Cut the roll into even pieces and add to the lunch box or snack platter.






STUDENT VOTE PROGRAM FOR THE 2024 BRITISH COLUMBIA PROVINCIAL ELECTION


