This month, Teagan brought in a black bear tooth for Show and Share. Mr. Ewald visited the Grade 2 classroom with several bear skulls from his collection to help identify the tooth and teach the class more about the species it came from. How fortunate we are to have a hands-on science teacher at our school who can deepen our students' curiosity. If you haven't yet explored our science room, it's well worth a visit. With a museum-like collection of locally sourced animal hides, skulls, and even preserved body parts, it's a great place to explore with your child whenever you're visiting the school for other activities.









This month, the Grade 5/6 class at HCS has been creating button blankets, inspired by the traditional ones worn by Northwest Indigenous tribes for ceremonial purposes. Students had the opportunity to choose a Wet'suwet'en clan to represent in their work: Gil_seyhu (Big Frog), Laksilyu (Small Frog), Gitdumden (Wolf/Bear), Laksamshu (Fireweed), or Tsayu (Beaver Clan). To deepen their understanding of these blankets and their cultural significance, students had the privilege of being visited by Sharon Redford and Sam Birkedal. During the visit, the students learned about the symbolic meaning of colours in traditional clothing and blankets, listened to a song played on a hand drum, and explored Wet'suwet'en traditions. Other elementary classes also joined in the experience. A heartfelt thank you to Sharon and Sam for generously sharing their time and knowledge with us!

Many of you know the Seinen family at Houston Christian School: Jon, Jana, Liam (Grade 12), Sydney (Grade 10) and Sawyer (Grade 8, homeschooled this year) have been an integral part of our community for many years. In March just before spring break, Sawyer, age 13, went to Edmonton for a medical procedure related to his congenital heart disease. During recovery, there were serious complications. Sawyer has lost the use of his legs and is now a T8 paraplegic. Jon, Jana and Sawyer spent weeks in Edmonton at Stollery Children's Hospital. On April 17, Sawyer was transferred to Sunny Hill Health Centre in Vancouver where he is participating in its acute rehab program for the next few months. There is no exact date of when Sawyer will be able to come home to Houston. As this has a lifelong impact on Sawyer and his family, we as a community would like to be a blessing and support to them through this event and fundraising campaign.
